Richmond is located four miles from the eastern boundary of Indiana, at the junction of several main highways, bus routes, and railroad lines. From the north and east both train and bus connections may be made either through Ft. Wayne, Indiana, or Dayton, Ohio; from the west and from the south, through Muncie or Indianapolis, Indiana, and through Cincinnati, Ohio. City buses, or a reasonable taxi service, connect bus and railroad terminals with Earlham College, which lies just beyond the western city limits. After first arrival, necessary transportation will be provided for.
