Wabash College is in the south-west quadrant of Crawfordsville, two blocks south and two west of the Court House. It can be entered from Grant Avenue, two blocks west of Washington (U.S. 231 and Ind. 43), or from Wabash Avenue, three blocks south of Market Street (U.S. 136). The Campus Center is the building with tall columns on the west side of the college quadrangle. Center Hall is just across the quadrangle from the Campus Center, and Waugh Hall is just north of Center Hall.

Recommended overnight accommodations: The Crawford Hotel, The Riviera Motel (south edge of town on U.S. 231 and Ind. 43), and the Crawfordsville Motel (east edge of town on U.S. 136). Rates at both motels begin at \$7.00; the hotel is somewhat cheaper.
